The presbyterian church ladies have booked St. John-in-the-Wilderness Hall during the day on Tuesday Sept 23, 2025.

Property Committee – Brian B.

The grass was planted over the new Big-O drain line installed north of the Church and Hall. Garden has been weeded, and trees have been trimmed. NW storage facility is going to have a cold air duct installed to eliminate the musty smell since this room is not ventilated. The two red doors at the front of the church need to be replaced due to their condition. Minor electrical upgrades are going to be booked for the Church and Hall. We have started the installation of the old St Bart's PA system. The speakers have been mounted and some wires pulled. We hope to have the amplifier working by early October.

We are looking at a church cleanup from 1 to 4 pm on Saturday, October 25, 2025, where many volunteers make easy work. Everyone from the parish is welcome to come help (inside and outside the church).

ACW Report

The ACW is having a smoked pulled pork dinner on October 18, 2025. Bruce and Kyle are cooking for this event. A silent auction will follow with a singing session for the finale.

There will be a church Bake Sale between 10am-12pm on Saturday, November 29, 2025. Everyone in the parish is encouraged to bake and buy. Last year many people from the community purchased baking (and some even donated baking). It was a marvelous gathering of community.

On Wednesday December 3rd, 2025, a Christmas ACW dinner will be held at John's restaurant. Other Anglican churches in the Deanery are also welcomed at this event.

We are also planning an ACW Church service and lunch. It will be hosted by St. John-in-the-Wilderness in the first quarter of 2026. Other Anglican churches in the Deanery will be invited.

Treasurer's Report

Our operating costs are lower mostly due to operating with an interim priest.

Our Bank account is healthy, and we are looking at moving some funds to GICs.
